4th of July 2017 - One of the most important documents in human history, the Declaration of Independence was drafted by John Adams, Benjamin Franklin, Thomas Jefferson, Robert Livingstone, and Roger Sherman. With startling brevity and power, especially for a document created by a committee, it succinctly expresses the principles shared by the Founding Fathers, drawing heavily on the writings of philosopher John Locke. It was adopted by the Continental Congress in amended form on July 4, 1776, at the Pennsylvania State House.

As we celebrate our country's birth, let us remember the importance of these documents;

Jefferson borrowed language from the Virginia Declaration of Rights adopted June 12, 1776, and Franklin did the same for the Pennsylvania Declaration of Rights adopted on August 16, 1776, both included: That all men are by nature equally free and independent and have certain inherent and inalienable rights amongst these are life, liberty, and the means of acquiring & possessing property, and pursuing happiness. Let us not forget these important truths.
